



“Co-Gen” Rate  
Renewable Energy Power Production  
Less than 10 KW  
Effective January 1, 2012

Availability

- This rate is available to any Consumer who desires to interconnect an on-site generator with the Wabash County REMC system, and sell excess electric energy to Wabash County REMC.
- The generator must be a “Qualifying Facility” (Q.F.) as defined in the Public Utility Regulatory Policy Act of 1978 (PURPA)
- This rate is limited to generators which utilize a renewable source of energy such as biomass, wind or solar, to power a generator rated at 10 kilowatts or less.

Scope

The installation of a Q.F. is primarily intended to offset part of the Consumer’s own electrical usage at that service location. Any excess energy which may flow back onto the REMC’s electrical system will be purchased at Wabash County REMC’s avoided cost.

Character of Service

The type of service rendered under this rate shall be limited to single-phase, sixty (60) Hertz, and at standard 120/240 voltage.

Purchase Rate -- Monthly

Energy Credit: “Avoided Cost”

Avoided Cost

Kilowatt hours that flow to the Wabash County REMC system which are recorded on the “buy back” meter, will be credited to the consumer’s account at a rate determined yearly by Wabash County REMC’s Wholesale power supplier. The purchase amount is shown as a credit or reduction of the customer’s regular billing account.

Conditions of Service

- This rate is limited to renewable energy generators with a total output of 10 KW or less. Larger on-site generators or generators using traditional fuel sources are not eligible.
- All out-of-pocket expenses Wabash County REMC incurs in association with the planning, design, inspection, installation and/or operation of the Q.F., must be paid by the Q. F. Such expenses would include but not be limited to: system upgrades, metering, relaying protection, labor cost, vehicle cost, etc.
- The installation must meet the minimum standards of the National Electric Code, the National Electric Safety Code and other governing codes. The Q.F. must install electrical devices that sufficiently assure Wabash County REMC, that all of its personnel and other

members of the cooperative are protected from harm or damage to their electrical equipment.

- The Q.F. must provide proof that sufficient safety equipment is installed to prevent electrical backfeed onto the Wabash County REMC system, at times when the Wabash County REMC system is off.
- The Q.F. must agree to a separate co-generation contract provided by Wabash County REMC to qualify for this rate.
